SUMMER AT NEWBERRY

The Newberry College Summer Sessions offer two distinct programs: two 5-week terms of “regular” Summer School and the May Term.

The summer curriculum is designed for students from Newberry and other colleges who wish to begin their college work early, for students who want to accelerate their progress or who need to make-up work, and for public school teachers who need to renew their certificates and credentials.

By attending the May Term (one course) and the two regular summer sessions (two courses each), students may earn a maximum of 19 semester hours of credit.

ADMISSION

Students may enter Newberry College as freshmen during the Summer Session provided they complete the entrance requirements of the College for admissions prior to June 1. Students from another college must have permission from the college in which they are presently enrolled indicating that they are in good standing in their own college. Teachers who apply for Summer School admission may be accepted on evidence of a valid teacher’s certificate.

PROGRAM FOR TEACHERS

As a concrete way of demonstrating that the College’s commitment to serve the schools in South Carolina, all elementary and secondary school teachers in the State are eligible for a tuition discount in the form of \$200 for each three hour course with a valid Teacher’s Certificate.

MAY TERM

The concentrated May Term offers seven courses.

The dates for the courses are listed with the course schedule. Registration should be completed on the first day of class.

Food Service **WILL NOT** be available.

May Term tuition is due on the first day of class and should be paid in the Accounting Office. Financial Aid is **NOT** available during May Term. Textbooks may be purchased in the College Book Store.

2015 SUMMER SESSION CLASSES

Regular Summer School classes will begin on Monday, June 1, for first term and on Monday, July 6, for second term unless otherwise noted. Classes will be held five days a week, Monday through Friday, for 95 minutes for each class meeting. Science labs will meet for 3 hours, 15 minutes, two days a week. Late afternoon and evening classes will meet for two hours, Monday-Thursday.

Because of the concentrated program of study, class absences will be permitted only for special circumstances. Details will be given at the beginning of the session by instructors.
